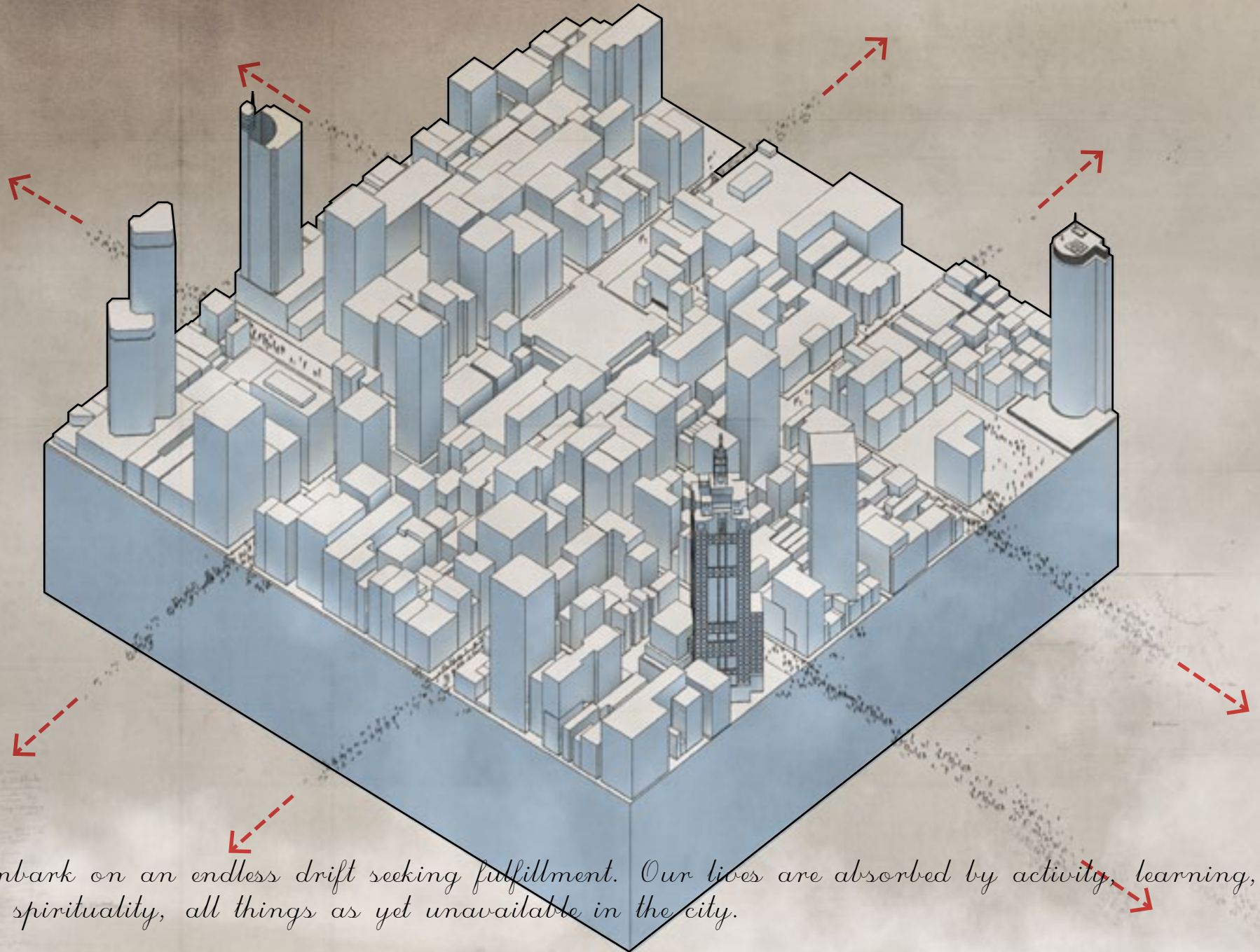


*Automation has led to the liberation of humanity from the toils of work. How would society evolve if we no longer worked in any capacity?*

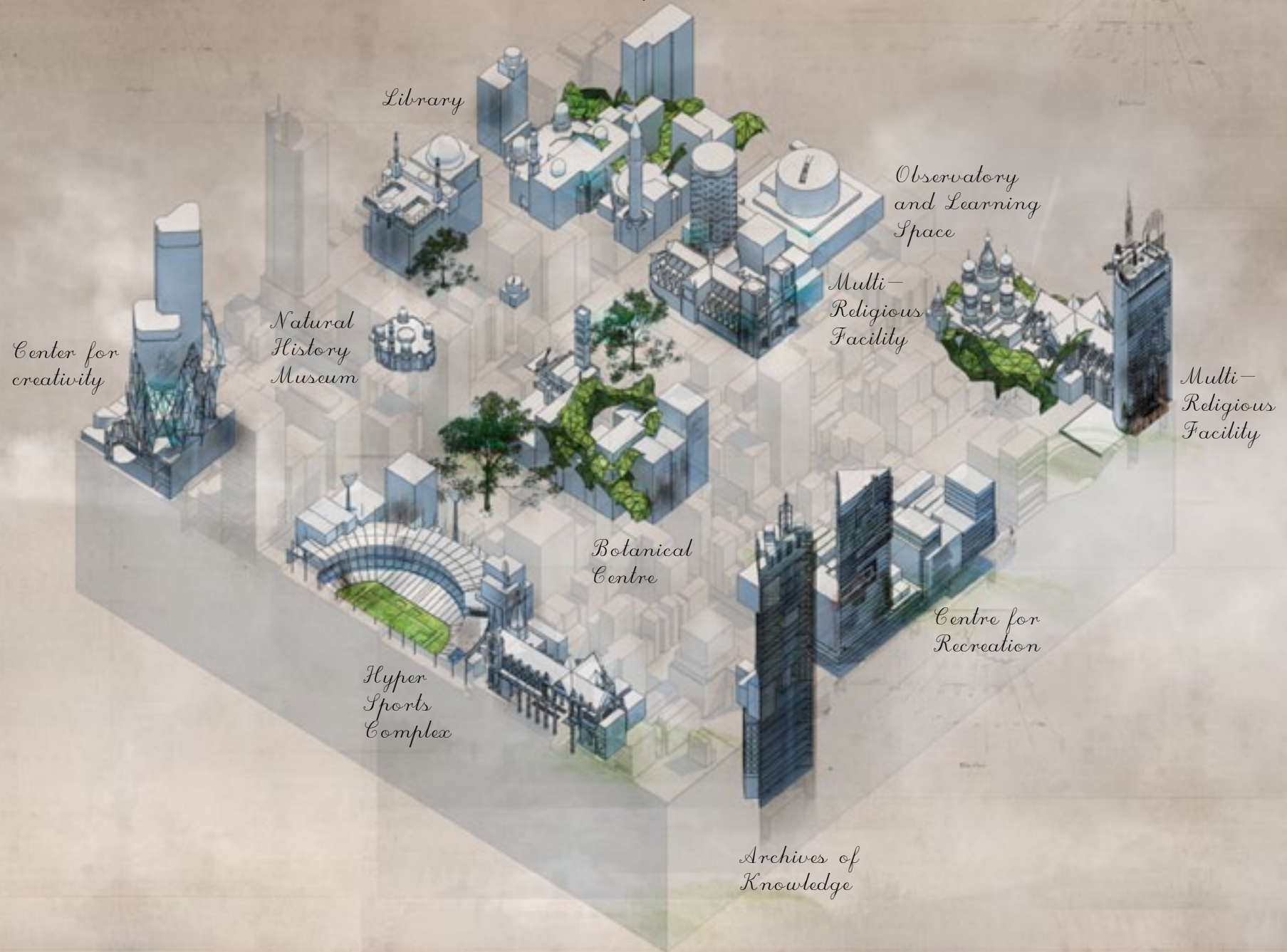
People embark on an endless drift seeking fulfillment. Our lives are absorbed by activity, learning, creating, spirituality, all things as yet unavailable in the city.

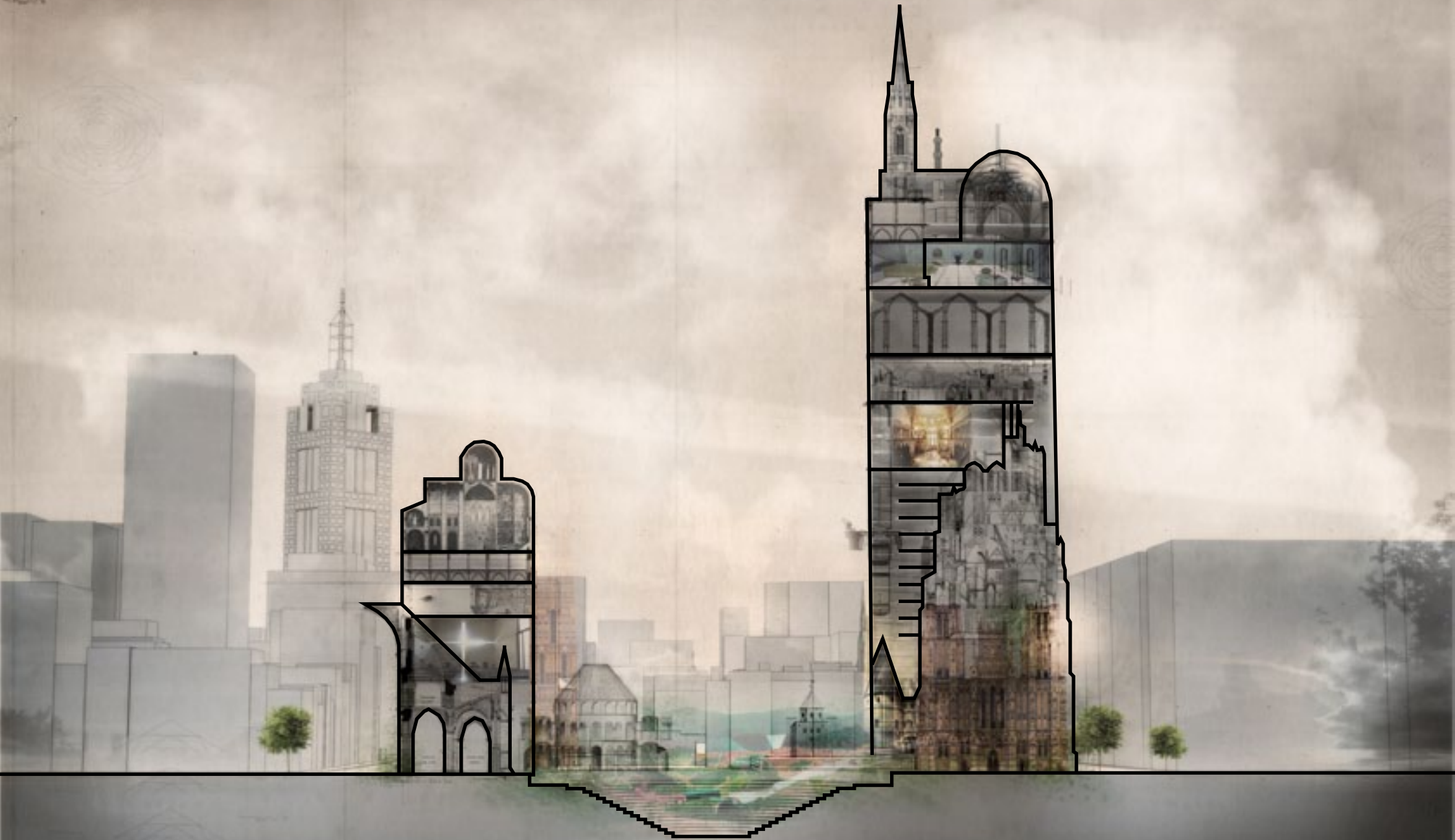

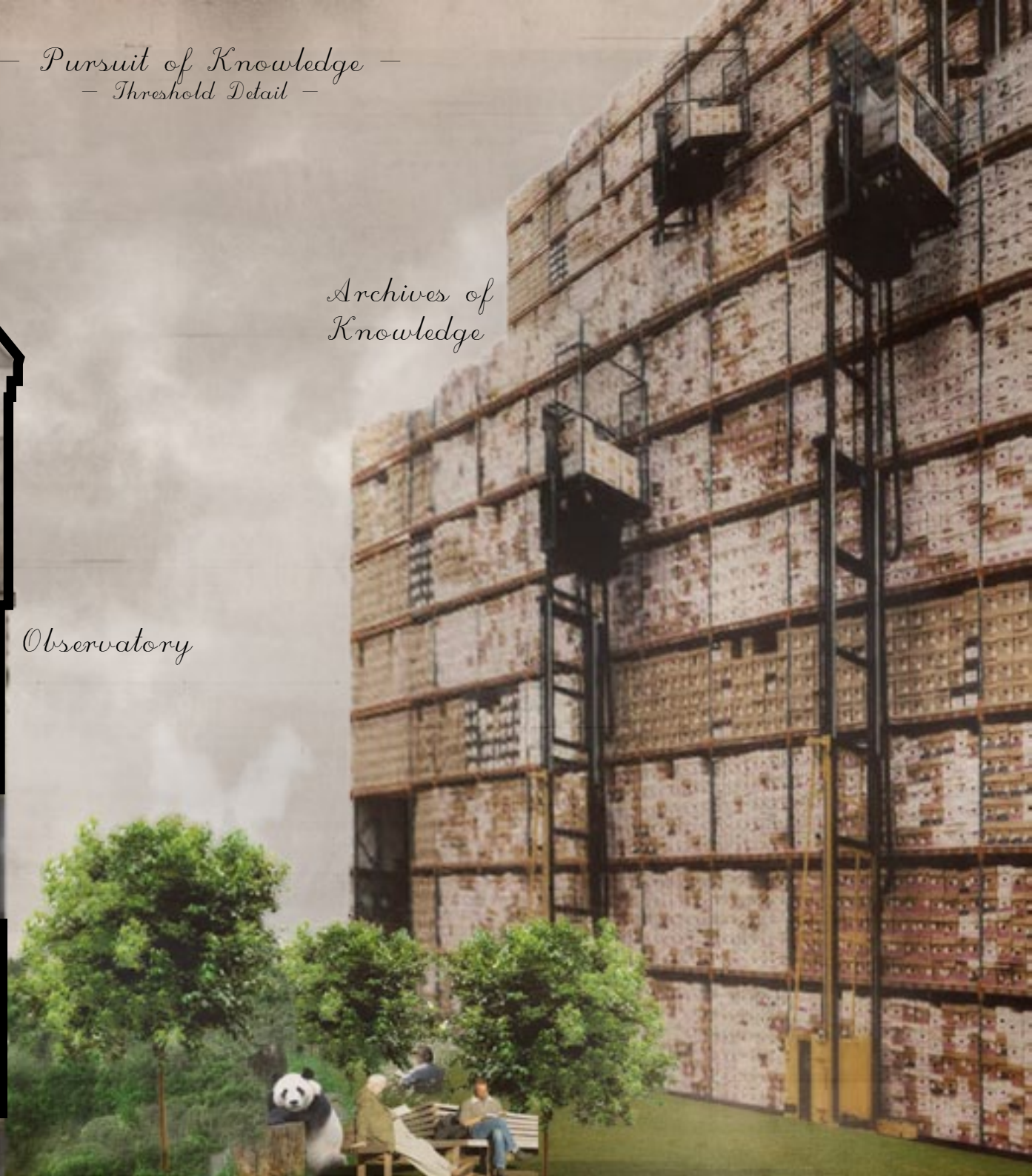

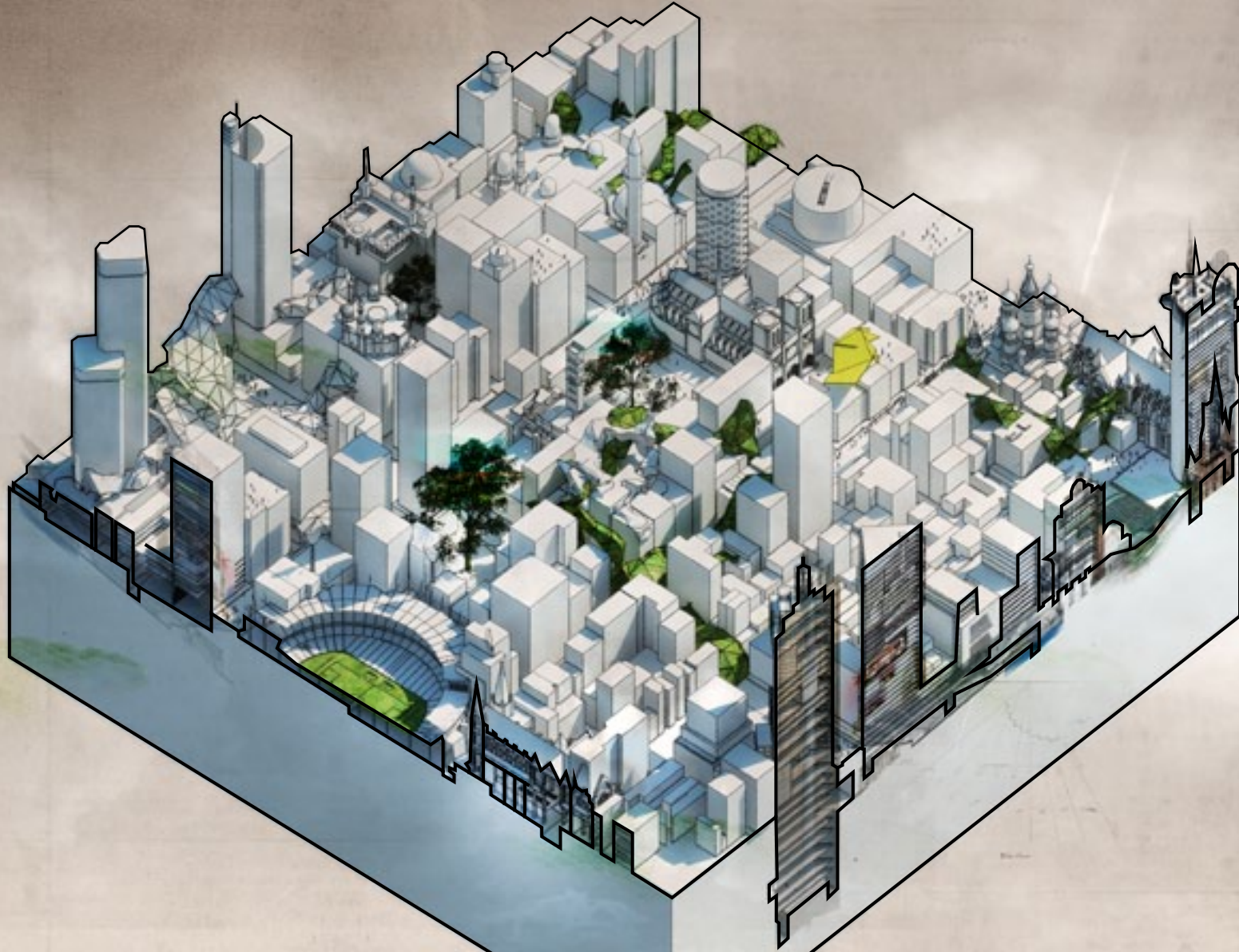
