The Victorian Government has announced the further easing of COVID-19 restrictions from 11.59pm Thursday 17 June.

- The 25km travel limit will be removed and travel between metropolitan Melbourne and regional Victoria will resume.
- Masks will continue to be required indoors but they are no longer required outdoors however they'll still be recommended when you can't maintain physical distancing.
- Hospitality venues can have up to 25 patrons before the density quotient applies.
- Gyms can open across Melbourne, with density limits and COVIDSafe Plans in place.
- Hair and beauty services can now operate without masks during service.
- **Melbournians** travelling to the snow this season are required to get a COVID-19 test within 72 hours of departing for Victoria's alpine resorts, and a negative result.
- If you can work from home, you should continue to work from home.
- Twenty people can gather outside in Melbourne, and 50 in regional Victoria.

Note: Cleaning, signage, record keeping, and other COVIDSafe requirements continue to apply for all venues and facilities with onsite operations as per the Workplace Directions. The Density Quotient (DQ) applies to all venues and spaces that are accessible to the public (and in closed workplaces, to shared spaces such as lunchrooms). Restrictions apply based on location and no longer follow a person if they travel between metropolitan Melbourne and regional Victoria.

Victorian Government QR Code Service

- All businesses are now required to use the <u>Victorian Government QR Code Service</u>, unless an exemption applies.
- For customer-facing venues and workplaces, such as hospitality venues and retail, it is mandatory to use the Victorian Government QR Code Service.
- For businesses that have not previously been mandated to use the Victorian Government QR Code Service prior to 11:59pm, Thursday 10 June 2021 an enforcement amnesty is in place until 11.59pm, Thursday 1 July. The enforcement amnesty for **retailers ended 17 June 2021.**
- Businesses that do not comply with Victoria's record keeping requirements will risk fines.
- Businesses must ensure that every customer and visitor has checked-in, no matter how long they are at the premises.
- Businesses can check in guests who don't have a smartphone via the Kiosk check-in function.
- Checking is the best way to help stop the spread of COVID-19.



Support for businesses

There are a number of support programs available to businesses that have been impacted by the restrictions:

- The <u>Circuit Breaker Business Support Package</u> provides support to employing and non-employing businesses. Applications are now open for the <u>Business Costs</u> <u>Assistance Program Round Two</u> and <u>Licensed Hospitality Venue Fund 2021</u>.
- The <u>Regional Tourism Support Package</u> provides direct assistance to tourism businesses, including accommodation providers, attractions and experiences.
- The <u>Victorian Events Support Package</u> provides support to event organisers, hosts and suppliers. Applications will open soon.
- Sole traders not registered for GST should check if they are eligible for the Australian Government's COVID-19 Disaster Payment for people affected by restrictions, announced on 4 June. For more information, please visit <u>Services Australia</u>



Getting tested

- Make sure all your workers know to get tested if they have any of the following symptoms: fever, chills or sweats, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, runny nose and loss or change in sense of smell or taste.
- After their test, they must go home immediately and stay there until they receive the result.
- If you are feeling unwell do not go to work. Anyone with symptoms should get tested immediately.
- The list of <u>testing sites</u> includes wait times.
- If you are worried you will lose pay while you wait for your results you may be eligible for a <u>COVID-19 Test Isolation Payment</u>.



Get vaccinated - don't wait until it's too late

- All Victorians over the age of 40 are eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine.
- The vaccine:
 - reduces your risk of getting sick
 - protects you against becoming very sick if you do get COVID-19
 - helps to protect your friends, family and community.
- Support your workers to get vaccinated. Appointments can be booked via: <u>www.coronavirus.vic.gov.au/vaccine</u>.
- The vaccines being used in Australia are safe and very effective at preventing serious illness and loss of life due to COVID-19.
- Workplace COVIDSafe practices continue to be vital, even if people in your workplace have been vaccinated.



Business information

Update your COVIDSafe Plan

- Every business with on-site operations must have a <u>COVIDSafe Plan</u>. They help you reduce the risk of COVID-19 in your workplace.
- Your COVIDSafe Plan is a list of safety actions. It should be reviewed and updated regularly and discussed with your workers.

Supporting collateral

- We have posters and signage that remind workers and customers of what they need to do to be COVIDSafe.
- We also have factsheets on good hygiene, cleaning and sanitising and resources that help you respond to restriction changes.
