I'm sorry that you had to move at a painfully slow pace through the Roman ruins.


Mostly, I'm sorry that I apologise so often.

I am so impressed by your knowledge, I am so impressed by your language and articulation, your directness and your affection and care.


















## Ellen Buttrose



Ellen made everybody in the group so comfortable so quickly.



This tour was a challenge and tremendous growth opportunity and I am so grateful for having been selected.




















