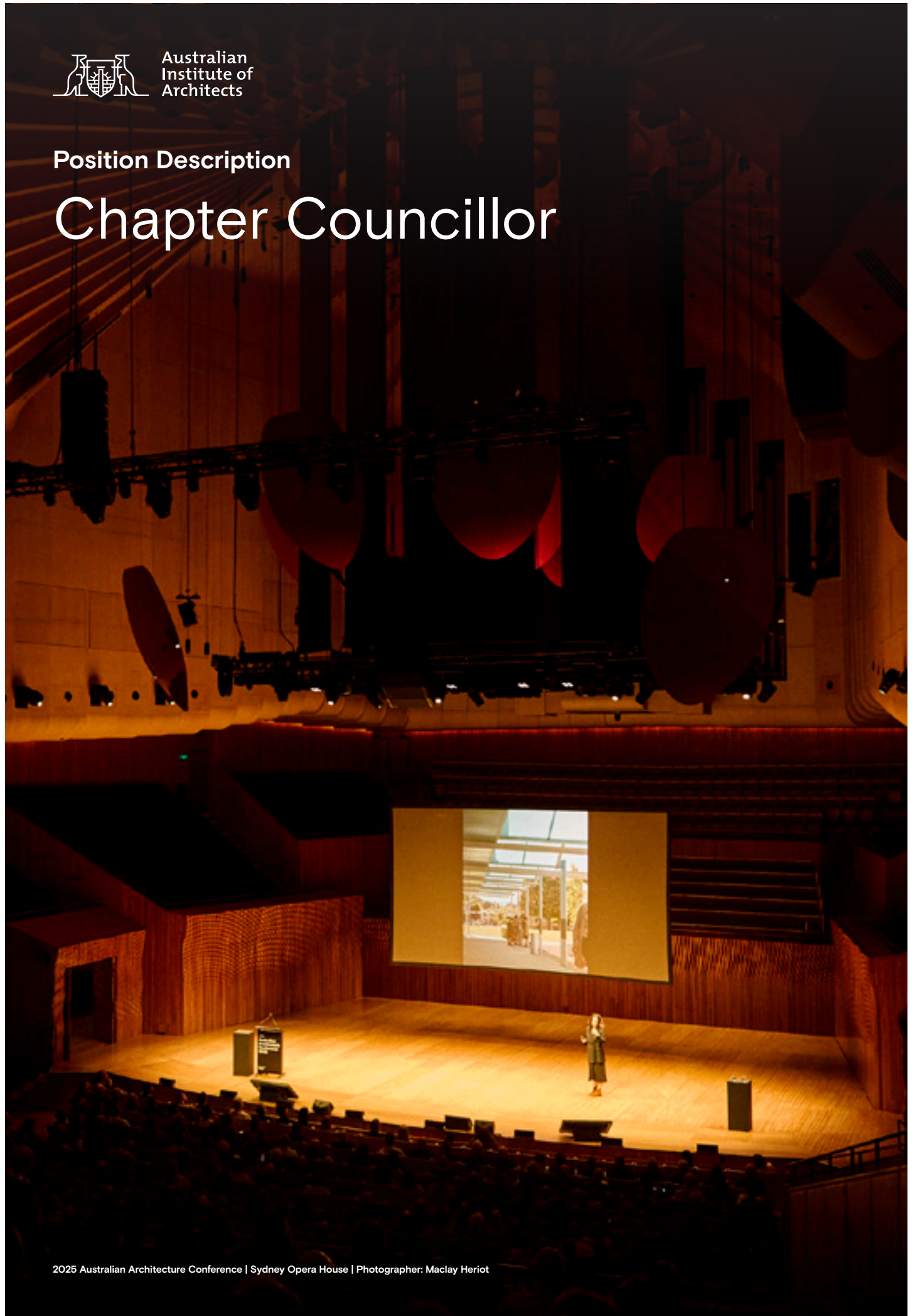

- Must adhere to the RAIA Policies, Codes and By-laws
- Elected Member Eligibility Declaration completion
