To provide a student perspective to Australian Institute of Architects' committees and focus groups. To advocate for student talent through publications, competitions and prizes.

REQUIREMENTS

The SONA Representative must meet the following requirements:

- At the time of application and commencement of the role, be a current and financial SONA member.
- Be attending classes or have contact hours at the University where they are appointed as SONA representative.
- Maximum of two co-representatives can be appointed at one university. Where
 this is the case, the co-representatives jointly represent one position. Special
 request is necessary for this and will be approved on a case-by-case basis by the
 Institute's National Membership Services Officer.

ACCOUNTABILITIES

You advance the interests of students by representing yourself, your university, university colleagues, SONA and The Australian Institute of Architects.

Typical responsibilities of a SONA rep may include:

- Working with your local chapter to organise local events, this may include office crawls, portfolio review nights and competitions.
- Working with the Institute and SONA executive to assist in delivering national events in your state, such as design competitions.
- Participation in regular meetings and email communications with SONA exec and Institute staff.
- Manage your states SONA Instagram account, following the Institutes branding and social media policies.
- Commit to approximately 2 hours of SONA related activities per week.
- Using provided templates and following the Institute branding guidelines to create graphics for local & national events for social media.
- Representing SONA on local Committees and working Groups SONA
 Representatives are expected to participate in Chapter Council meetings and
 other committee meetings such as Sustainability and Education in their local
 chapter.
- Actively particulate in national SONA committee meetings and contribute to the discussions, raising relevant items at local committee meetings



LEADING FROM THE FRONT

- Upholding and promoting the Institute's values and culture and encouraging fellow SONA Members to do the same.
- Actively working on behalf of SONA Members to identify and respond to issues aligned to the Institute's strategy and policy.
- Promoting open and collegial communications between SONA Members, the National SONA Committee and Institute staff.
- guiding SONA's theme; national programs and—in collaboration with the SONA executive leadership team and the Institute staff—the implementation of SONA's strategic plan.
