Statement of Significance

The innovative U-shaped plan looks inward to a courtyard with a pool. Detail throughout the house is interesting and unique, and reflects the freedom given to the architect by his clients. The selection of the site was most unusual as the architect made the selection from a choice of four in which his client was interested. The client's requirement for privacy was well met by the battle-axe site and the design of the house which has very few windows to the front. The siting and design of the building allows the courtyard to capture the northerly sun, while allowing a retreat from the Australian climate with a wide verandah surrounding the courtyard. Awarded C S Daley Medal 1969.

Description

The house is designed to take full advantage of the Australian climate and opportunities for outdoor living. A modern version of the Australian Colonial homestead, with verandahs facing inward to a private enclosed courtyard with outdoor living areas and swimming pool. The house displays a simplicity of line and design. Maximum privacy is achieved by the U-shaped plan, with all areas facing into the atrium like, quarry tiled courtyard. Windows in the exterior walls tend to be discreetly located to avoid being overlooked. The living and dining area are open plan, divided by a marble topped bar. Heavy cross-beams give a feeling of space to the living room, the end wall of which is a redwood and glass curtain wall with a view over the Brindabella Ranges. The fireplace is set into a low brick screen dividing the entrance hall from this area, the floor is paved with German floor tiles on a heated concrete slab. External and internal brickwork painted white, with Canadian redwood timber trim and windows. Skylights in roof admit extra light, pierced brickwork used to form screens to some windows and lighten the solidarity of brickwork.

Excellent. Fence to surround pool has been added.

Background/History
